

Petition for Incorporation

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, of Perry County, Ohio.

The undersigned petitioners for the purpose of forming the territory hereinafter described into a municipal Corporation respectfully represent that they have attached hereto and made a part hereof an accurate map of said territory or so sought to be incorporated. Marked "A." Which said territory is situated in Monroe Township Perry County Ohio. and bounded and described as follows, to wit, Commencing thirty rods South of the South West Corner of Section (15) township (12) Range (14) thence East (60) rods, thence North (236 1/2) feet being forty six rods and twelve links (40 rods North of the center of Section (15) thence West (82) rods, thence South 45 1/2 West (42) rods thence S 38 1/2 N to Lot No 368 of Addition to Perry Co. thence West along the North side of Lots 368 and 371 to alley on the west side of Lots 371 & 386, both included, thence South along the Alley to half Section line, thence West on half Section line to west boundary of said Section (15), thence South on Section line to South boundary of The Ohio Central Railroad Switch, thence West along right of way of The Ohio Central Railroad 393.5 feet, thence South 707 feet to County road, thence East along County road 168 1/2 feet, thence South 120 feet thence N.E. 165 feet to Section line, thence South on section line to the place of beginning.

Copies of Journal Entries. June 5th 1882.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session, Present Nathan Plank and Samuel Snider. In the matter of the Incorporation of Corning } This day came Artemus H Ward, and presented a petition to this Board, praying for the Incorporation of Corning Perry County, Ohio, as a village. It is therefore ordered that the same be immediately filed in the office of the County Auditor of said County, which is accordingly done and on the 7th day of August A.D. 1882 at one o'clock P.M. at the said Auditor's office at the Court House in said County, the same will be for hearing and Artemus H. Ward is hereby notified.

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session, Present James Coyle, Nathan Plank and Samuel Snider. In the matter of the Incorporation of Corning, Perry County, O. } The petition filed at the June session of 1882, of the Commissioners of said County praying for the incorporation of a village styled Corning came on for hearing, being the time and place fixed for hearing by the Board of County Commissioners at the June session 1882 - and the Commissioners being fully satisfied from the exhibits and evidence that the petitioners and their agents were duly and legally informed of the time and place of hearing said petition for more than sixty days after the filing of the same and that due and legal notice was given by the agent of said petitioners for more than six consecutive weeks in the Corning Times a newspaper printed and published in said Perry County, and of general circulation therein of the time and hearing of said petition in pursuance to the Statutes in such cases - and on the 15th day of June 1882, said agent caused to be posted a copy of the notice published in said Newspaper in a conspicuous place, was in the limits of the proposed incorporation more than six weeks prior to the time fixed for the hearing, and the Board of Commissioners after hearing the evidence, and after having heard and examined the said petition, find that it contains all the matters required, that its statements are true and are satisfied that more than thirty qualified voters residing within the proposed corporate limits and on the territory therein laid off into lots plotted and acknowledged as in all respects to deeds, signed and subscribed to said petition. And that said Artemus H. Ward was the duly and legally appointed agent of said petitioners, that said limits have been accurately described, and that an accurate map or plat accompanied said petition and filed therewith, that the name proposed for said incorporated village is appropriate and that the proposed limits of said village are not unusually large or small, that there is the required population for the proposed incorporation to wit about 800. And the said Board of County Commissioners moreover decide it right and proper in the judgment said discretion of said Board of County Commissioners. - That said petition should be granted. It is therefore ordered that said petition be granted, that the incorporated village of Corning as named and described in the petition be organized and that this order be entered upon the journal.
