June 6th 1882. The Board of County Com- met pursuant to adjournment; Present: Nathan Plank & Samuel Snider. In the matter of the application of the Incorporated Village of New Lexington, Ohio, to enlarge the corporate limits of the same by annexation of contiguous territory.

This 6th day of June 1882 came Henry D Cochran and James D Retallic agents on the part of the Incorporated Village of New Lexington Perry County, Ohio, appointed by said Corporation to prosecute the proceedings herein - and presented their Petition to said Board of Commissioners at this their Regular Session praying for the annexation of certain contiguous territory to said Village, and it is ordered that said Petition be immediately filed in the office of the County Auditor to be subject to the inspection of any person interested, and the said commissioners fix Monday the 7th day of August 1882 at 1 o'clock P.M. at the Auditor's office in New Lexington said County for the hearing of said petition, and Cochran and Retallic are notified thereof.

August 7th 1882. The Board of County Commissioners met in Special Session; Present: Doyle, Plank and Snider.

In the matter of the petition to annex contiguous Territory to the Incorporated Village of New Lexington, Perry County, Ohio. This 7th day of August at one o'clock P.M. This Petition filed herein on the 6th day of June 1882 praying for the annexation of certain contiguous territory to said Village came on for hearing and trial before the said Board of County Commissioners at the time and place fixed for said hearing by said Board of County Commissioners at their June Session 1882 and said Board of Commissioners being fully satisfied after hearing the evidence adduced on the part of said Petitioners do find that each and every allegation in the Petition contained are true, that the agents appointed by said Village to prosecute the proceedings herein were duly and legally appointed by and were notified according to law for more than sixty days prior to this date. That due and legal notice was given by the agents of said Petitioners for more than six weeks in the New Lexington Herald, a newspaper printed and published in said Village and County, and of general circulation therein, of the time and place appointed for such hearing, that in pursuance to the Statute in such cases and on the 9th day of June 1882 said agents posted a copy of the notice published in said newspaper in a conspicuous place on each and all of the territory proposed to be annexed according to law. Thereupon came Lyman Jackson and filed his certain motion to dismiss the proceedings for reasons in said motion set forth, and the Board after hearing the arguments find said motion not well taken and over rule the same and no further paper being filed the said Board finding that all the allegations, statements and facts set forth in said petition are true, and that said Board deems it right and proper in its judgement and discretion that the prayer and the object of said petition should be granted, It is therefore ordered that said Petition be granted and that all the territory described and included within the boundary set forth in the Petition and Plat be and the same hereby is annexed to said Village and is a part thereof, and said Board hereby releases all power over the same as fully as the law will, and that all of the prayer of said Petitioners are granted and that this order be entered upon the Journal.

"An Ordinance"

Declaring the annexation of Contiguous Territory to the Village of New Lexington, Perry County, Ohio. Section 1st Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of New Lexington, Perry County, Ohio, that the Clerk of the Village having reported to the Village Council the final Transcript of the proceedings of the County Commissioners of Perry County on the Petition of the Village for the annexation of contiguous territory in pursuance of the ordinance passed March 3rd 1882 entitled, An Ordinance to annex contiguous territory to the Incorporated Village of New Lexington, and also said Petition and the map or plat accompanying the said Petition, and the Village Clerk having also reported to the Council that more than sixty days have elapsed since said final Transcript map or plat and Petition were filed in his office and that no Petition was presented to the Court of Common Pleas or Judge thereof to enjoin said proceedings it appearing by said Transcript that the said Commissioners have granted the prayer of the Village for the annexation of contiguous territory as described and set forth in said former ordinance, it is now therefore hereby declared that said application for annexation is hereby accepted and that said annexation is complete, and that said territory so annexed is included in and constitutes part of the said Village, and that the inhabitants residing therein shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of the inhabitants within the original limits of the corporation.

Section 2nd That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its legal publication. Passed March 19th 1883. James E Johnston, Mayor, Attest, David D Brush, Clerk
