To all whom it may concern: - Notice is hereby given that on the 7th day of December 1854, a petition was presented to the Commissioners of Perry County Ohio, by the undersigned Mayor, Recorder and Trustees of the incorporated village of Somerset in said county, and filed in the Office of the Auditor of said County for the inspection of all persons interested, which petition in substance sets forth the corporate limits of said village being contained within certain limits defined on the plat attached thereto, commencing at the north west corner of out lot No. 1, thence north east to the south west corner of lot No. 189, thence north west to the north west corner of lot No. 182, thence north east to the north east corner of lot No. 181 thence south east to the south east corner of lot 174, thence north east to the north east corner of lot 233 thence south east to the south east corner of lot No. 68, thence south east to the south east corner of lot No. 152, thence south west to the north east corner of lot No. 165, thence south east to the north east corner of lot No. 173, thence south west to the south west corner of said lot No. 173, thence north west to the north west corner of lot No. 162 thence south west to the north east corner of lot No. 8, thence south east to the south east corner of said out lot No. 8, thence south west to the south west corner of out lot No. 5, and thence north west to the place of beginning, containing about 78 acres 3 R. 22 P. and the corporate authorities of said village being desirous of annexing thereto certain territory lying outside of said corporate limits and within certain boundaries as defined on said plat as beginning at the south east corner of the west 1/2 of section No. 10, T. Wood 27 chains and 64 links to the 1/2 section line at the Brownville road, thence south along said half section line 63 chains and 39 links to the beginning containing about 62.5 acres 2 R. 15 P. of the territory proposed to be annexed making with that already included about 78 A. 23 R. - - They the corporate authorities aforesaid, on the 15th day of September 1854, passed an ordinance in conformity to the act entitled an act to provide for the organization of cities and incorporated villages, passed May 3rd 1852 whereby the question whether said territory should or should not be annexed to said corporation was submitted to the qualified electors thereof to be decided by vote at the then next general election to be held on the 2nd day of Oct. 1854, which ordinance was duly published for 4 consecutive weeks in the Somerset Post, a newspaper printed and of general circulation in said County of Perry. The first insertion being on the 6th day of September 1854, at least one month prior to said election a copy of which ordinance so published, attached to said petition, that in conformity with said Ordinance on said 2nd Tuesday of October 1854 a vote was taken upon said question by said electors, the whole number of votes cast being 133, of which 125 were cast in favor of said annexation, 6 votes against it and 2 ballots as will appear, reference being had to the poll book of the vote taken on said question on file in the office of the Recorder of said Corporation. The petition prays that the aforesaid territory lying outside of the present limits of said corporation, and within the boundaries last described may be annexed to said incorporated village of Somerset and that an order to that effect may be granted by said Commissioners under such rules and regulations as are provided in the act above referred to. Notice is hereby further given that the 8th day of February 1855 at 1 o'clock P. M. of said day has been appointed by said Commissioners for the hearing of said petition, at the Auditor's Office in Somerset Perry County Ohio.
