# HUSTONS SECOND ADDITION TO NEW LEXINGTON



Scale 5 rods to an inch.

Stones are planted at the corners of lots marked A, B, C, D.

The town lots of R. C. Huston's 2<sup>d</sup> addition to New Lexington, are of various dimensions as by reference to the Plat will designate the contents or area of each lot. Elizabeth Street commences at the S. W. corner of Lot No. 139 and runs N. 57° E. 3 rods to a post on the alley, and thence north 42° E. throughout and is 3 rods wide. Jackson Street runs N. 39° W. and is 3 rods wide. Brook Street runs north 36 1/2° E. from the S. E. corner of lot No. 136 and is 3 rods wide. The lots in the S. E. block are all square from the bearing of Jackson Street by lines running N. 35° E. Except the eastern boundary of lot No. 136 which runs N. 36 1/2° E. to the S. E. corner of lot No. 145. The alley on the north side of said block runs N. 39° E. The division lines of the lots N. W. and E. of Elizabeth Street runs N. 48° W. and S. 48° E. The alleys are each one rod wide and as for any other explanation contents of lots or distances &c. see Plat. Surveyed July 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> 1857 by James Brown Surveyor.

State of Ohio, Perry County, ss. Personally came before me Robert C. Huston and Elizabeth Huston his wife Grantors of the foregoing Addition to New Lexington, and acknowledged the same to be their voluntary act and deed for the special purposes therein mentioned. Also afterwards appeared the said Elizabeth Huston wife of the said Robert C. Huston and being examined by me, separate and apart from her said husband and the contents of said town plat being made known to her she did on such separate examination declare that she did voluntarily sign seal and does now acknowledge the same, and that she is still satisfied therewith.
