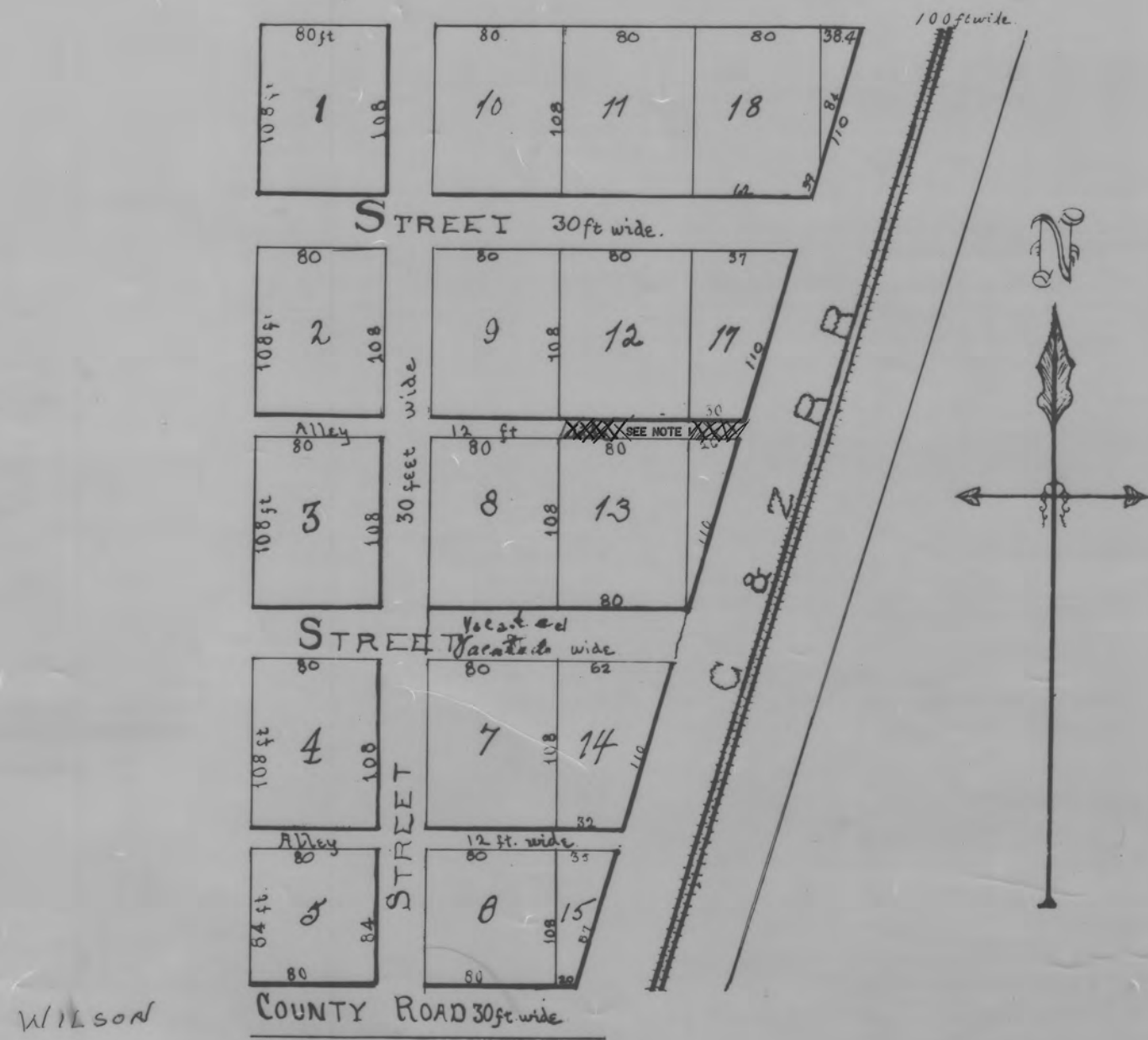

ADDITION TO ROSEVILLE

Armstrong's Addition to the Town of Roseville.
 This is to certify that on the 11th day of September 1864 at the request of John Armstrong Esq. the land as platted above with streets and alleys running at right angles with the exception of the Railroad which bears south 18 1/2° West which lots were surveyed and correctly laid down as 108 feet long by 80 feet wide to which is added the fractional lots at the south end on the County Road & also on the Rail Road. Said lots are numbered from 1 to 19

It is vacated that certain unnamed street running East and West between lots numbered seven and fourteen on the south and lot eight, thirteen, and sixteen on the north of Armstrong's Addition to the village of Roseville, Ohio, from the western line of the C. & M. V. Railroad line (now the Pennsylvania Railroad Line) to the east side of the street running north and south on the west side of lots numbered seven and eight of Armstrong's Addition to the village of Roseville, Ohio.

Whereas, on the 4th day of November, 1946, a petition by persons owning lots in the immediate vicinity of that certain unnamed street running east and west between lots numbered seven and fourteen on the south and lot eight, thirteen and sixteen on the north of Armstrong's Addition to the village of Roseville, Ohio, from the western line of the C. & M. V. Railroad line (now the Pennsylvania Railroad Line) to the east side of the street running north and south on the west side of lots numbered seven and eight of Armstrong's Addition to the village of Roseville, Ohio was duly presented to Council praying that said street between the points named, be vacated, and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required by law by publication in *The Roseville Leader*, a newspaper of general circulation in the Corporation, for two consecutive weeks, ending December 11, 1946; and

Whereas Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made, now therefore,

Be It Ordained By the Council of the Village of Roseville, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That that certain unnamed street running east and west between lots numbered seven and fourteen on the south and lot eight, thirteen and sixteen on the north of Armstrong's Addition to the village of Roseville, Ohio, from the western line of the C. & M. V. Railroad line (now the Pennsylvania Railroad Line) to the east side of the street running north and south on the west side of lots numbered seven and eight of Armstrong's Addition to the village of Roseville, Ohio, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 2: That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Passed January 6, 1947.
