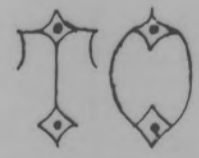

EXPLANATIONS.

Central Street runs due east and west and is 3 rods wide. Lumber Street is a continuation of Lumber Street in Kaul's New Addition and is 2 rods wide. Main Street is a continuation of Main Street in New Lexington. Water Street is a continuation of Water Street on the same angle at which it passes through Kaul's New Addition. Jackson is a continuation of Jackson Street in New Lexington. Cross Street is a continuation of Cross Street in the Railroad Addition. The alley running between Nos. 200 + 201 is 12 feet wide and is a continuation of an alley in the Railroad Addition. The alley running between Nos. 206, 207, 209 + 210 is 16 1/2 feet wide and runs parallel with Lumber Street. The alley running between 206, 207, 208, 209 + 210 is 16 1/2 feet wide is a continuation of an alley in New Lexington and runs parallel with Main Street. The alley in the rear of Lots 193, 194 + is in the Railroad Addition.

The figures on the lines of the lots indicate the length in rods and feet. The lines of all the lots north of Central Street run east and west & north and south, except the line on the east side of No. 193 which runs north 22 1/2° east - the line on the west end of of Lots No. 192 + 191 runs north 22 1/2° east, all the other lines on said lots run east west and north & south.

The lines of all the other lots run parallel and at right angles with Main Street. Except the lines on Central Street which run east and west. Stones are planted at the street corners of lots numbered 193, 195, 196, 205, 206, 209, 210 and 211
