



Comly's 3rd Addition
 TO
 NEW LEXINGTON

Laid out and platted March 5th 1868

Situate at the South East corner of the South East quarter of section 5, in Township Fifteen, of Range 15, commencing at the south east corner of said quarter section, on the present line of the corporation of New Lexington, thence west on the line of said quarter section 30 rods thence north to the Somerset road (marked Somerset Street) thence westerly along said road or street to the place of beginning. The area enclosed to be an out lot in New Lexington and contains 18 acres more or less. Somerset Street or Road is 50 feet wide, one half the width on the lands of said David Comly included in the road as at present. Said street (or road) and out lot platted to the street or road assigned to the village of New Lexington with the view of bringing said street or road within the incorporated limits of said village. Witness my hand & seal this 5th day of March A.D. 1868.
