

KELLY'S ADDITION TO NEW LEXINGTON

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This Plat of lots is situated in the north west quarter of section No. 9, township No. 15 of Range 15, 2d Meridian. The lots are numbered from 247 to 346 both inclusive, and are 66 feet by 132 feet and contain of an acre, except the fractional lots which are of various dimensions as well. In case of a reference to the plat which designates lot of the lines of said fractional lots, the figures are for chains and links. Water Street is a continuation of Water Street in New Lexington and is three rods wide and runs south 57° West to the section line between Sec. 8 and 9. Spring Street and North Street are each three rods wide and run parallel with Water Street. Pleasant, Washington, State and Hill Streets are each three rods wide and run North 39° West from Water Street. South Street is 22 feet 6 inches wide and runs north 39° West from Water Street. Factory Street is 3 rods wide and commences at Spring Street in front of lot No. 30 and runs north 39° West and intersects the alley on the north side of lot No. 33. The alleys are all one rod wide, the lines dividing the lots run south 57° West except the lines dividing lots fronting on Water Street, these run north 39° West from Water Street. Stones are placed to regulate future survey at the S.E. corner of Lot No. 1 and at the south west corner of lot No. 77 and at the north west corner of No. 90, and at the north east corner of lot No. 76, and at the north east corner of lot No. 45, and at the north east corner of lot No. 33, and at the south east corner of lot No. 5. For any further explanation as to contents of lots, distances &c. - See plat.
