Said down by a scale of 10 perches to an inch. The above plat is intended to represent the town of Lebanon situate on the road leading from Newark to New Lancaster on Section 9 Township 18, Range 17 in the county of Fairfield. The above described town is laid out on due courses North and South by East and West, consisting of two squares, each square containing four lots of a quarter of an acre each making in all forty-eight lots in number beginning at the N.E. corner with the first number, then west and east alternately throughout the whole. The streets are 49 1/2 feet wide. The surrounding alleys are 16 feet wide, and the cross alleys 20 feet wide.
