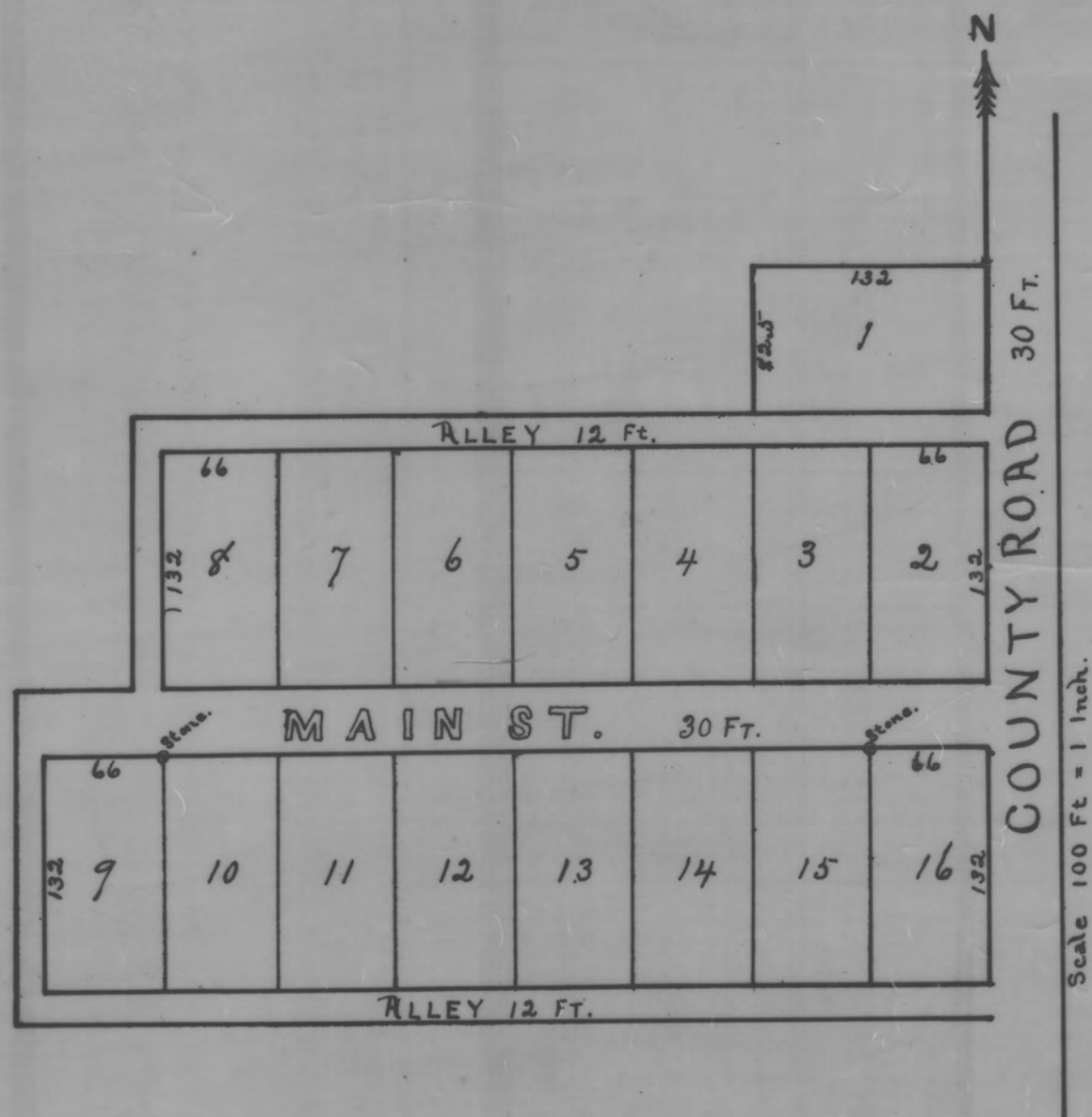


THE VILLAGE OF CONAWAY. HARRISON TP.



The Village of Conaway.

Commencing at a point 15 feet west of the South East corner of the North West quarter of Section 28, Township 14, Range 14, thence North 370.5 feet; thence West 132 feet; thence South 82.5 feet; thence West 342 feet; thence South 144 feet; thence West 66 feet; thence South 174 feet; thence East 540 feet to the place of beginning, containing $4\frac{37}{100}$ acres. The Lots are all 66×132 and contain $\frac{7}{100}$ of an acre, Except Lot No. 1 which is 82.5×132 and contains $\frac{7}{100}$ of an acre. Streets & alleys are marked on plat Variation 4° left, Stones are planted at NW corner of Lot 16, the NW corner of Lot No. 10.
