The foregoing papers and transcript filed with the corporation clerk of the Village of Corning, Nov. 16th 1904.
On the matter of the annexation of the New territory to the Village of Corning, Ohio, being now presented, the Clerk,
having received the transcript and petition Nov. 16th 1904, from the Auditor of Perry County, Ohio, and the period of
Sixty days having elapsed since the same was filed, the same was this 17th day of January, 1905, and being the next regular
meeting of the Council after the expiration of Sixty days from the day of said filing laid before said Council for acceptance
or rejection. Thereupon the ordinance committee presented the following ordinance of acceptance, to wit:

An ordinance accepting the application for annexation of certain territory to the Village of Corning, Ohio.
Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Corning, Ohio, as follows:-

Section 1: That the application of J. M. Wine and others of the inhabitants residing on the following territory,
adjacent to this Village, described in the map and petition, placed before the Council as, Commencing at the south-west
corner of lot No. 386 of the Village of Ferrara, Perry County, Ohio, which is attached to the said Village of Corning for incorporation purposes,
thence running south eight feet to the half section line, running east and west through section 15 of Monroe Township, this County,
thence running west, said half section line 292 feet to the place of beginning; - and thence running north 1604 feet to a
point 16 feet west and 60 feet north of the north-west corner of lot No. 149 of the Village of Ferrara this County, said point being on the
north side of Oak Street of said Village of Ferrara, thence running east along the north side of said Oak Street 392 feet to a point; thence
running north 760 feet to a point; thence running east along the south side of Dycamore Street of said Village 612 feet to a point
60 feet east of the north-east corner of lot No. 322, of said Village of Ferrara and on the east side of Jefferson Street of said Village;
thence running south along the east side of said Jefferson Street 760 feet to the north line of Oak Street of said Village of
Ferrara; thence east along the north side of said Oak Street 250 feet, thence south 860 feet to the present corporation line
of the said Village of Corning and being the north boundary line of said Corporation of Corning, thence following said
present line of said Village of Corning, west and south to the place of beginning. All said territory being located in the north-west
quarter of Section 15, of Monroe Township, Perry County, Ohio, be the same hereby is accepted.

Section 2: That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.
