

Then upon notice of the time and place of said election was duly given for a period of ten days by publication of said notice of such election in a newspaper of general circulation in such territory, to-wit: in the New Lexington Tribune published at New Lexington, Ohio, and that more than three printed notices thereof were posted in more than three public places in said territory for the period prescribed by law prior to the 4th day of September, 1913, said notice so published and posted being in the form following, to-wit:

Legal notice is hereby given that on the 4th day of September, 1913, at Stoneburner Building, Sautoy, in Township of Bearfield, County of Perry, an election will be held to determine whether the following described territory shall be incorporated into a village to be known as the village of Sautoy, Ohio, to-wit: The East half of Section thirty six of Bearfield Township, and the North East quarter of Section one of Monroe Township, Perry County, Ohio.

In the matter of the application for the incorporation of the village of Sautoy. Whereas, an election was held in the township of Bearfield, County of Perry and State of Ohio, on the 4th day of September, 1913, to determine whether the following described territory shall be incorporated into a village to be known as the "village of Sautoy" to-wit: The East half of Section 36, Bearfield Township, and the North-East quarter of Section 1 of Monroe Township, Perry County, Ohio; and

Whereas, at said election 116 votes were cast of which 81 votes were in favor of said incorporation, and 35 votes of which were against same, a majority being in favor of said incorporation,

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered and declared that said territory shall hence forth be deemed an incorporated village, and it is further ordered and declared that such village has been incorporated by the name of the village of Sautoy and a certified transcript of the Journal entries of all the proceedings of this Board in this matter, together with the original petition and plat, shall be delivered to the Recorder of Perry County, Ohio.
