Description

Oklahoma Addition to New Straitsville, Perry Co. O. includes the land laid off into streets and lots which are named and numbered and are shown on the plat of the same made to this date of 1 inch - 100 feet. The land covered by this addition lays south of the C. & H. N. & T. R. R. and east of said R. R. Company's right-of-way running up to the C. & H. C. & T. Co's Mine Co. 35. It forms a part of Sections Nos. 29 and 32, T. 10. N. 11, R. 15. Perry Co. O. Beginning at a title at the intersection of the south line of said section No. 29 and the west line of the East 1/2 of the South east 1/4 section No. 29. Run north from aforesaid title on the last described line 49 ft. thence angle left 90° 9' 13.9" ft. thence angle left 7° 54' which is the center line of Harrison Avenue. From this line, measuring from last named point all of the east and west streets and alleys are topped; going south on Harrison Ave. 64.3 ft. to center of Noble Street angle right 87° 54' 1/2 139.3 ft. to center of Window St. angle left 92° 6' 1/2 280 ft. to center of Rank alley, angle right 87° 54' 35.4 33 ft. to center of Nancy Alley, angle left 92° 61' 56.3 ft. to center of Western Avenue, angle left 90° 6'; Western Avenue is an old established Public Road going north from measuring point 76 ft. to center of Miller Alley, angle right 87° 54' 29 ft. to center of Proctor St. angle right 87° 54' on streets running east and west are parallel and 50 feet wide. The alleys are 20 feet wide, the regular lots are 121 ft. x 180 ft. and contain 1/2 acre
