Regular Session of County Commissioners. Present, Benjamin Pope, John C. Delong and Daniel Baker.  
In the matter of the petition of the Citizens of Shawnee for incorporation presented by their agent Cary A. Wilson the Board at the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November for hearing said petition.

Auditors Office Perry County Ohio, New Lexington O. Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> 1873.  
Commissioners met at Special Session Present, J. C. Delong, Daniel Baker & Benjamin Pope. In the matter of the Petition for the incorporation of Shawnee the Agent of the Petitioners Cary A. Wilson having notified the board of Commissioners that he could not be present on this day on account of a death in his family, the board adjourned to the 20<sup>th</sup> day of November 1873 for hearing the same.

Auditors Office, Perry Co. O. New Lexington O. November 20<sup>th</sup> 1873  
Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment Present, J. C. Delong, Benjamin Pope and Daniel Baker. In the matter of the Petition for the incorporation of Shawnee, filed at the September Session 1873, praying for the incorporation of a Village styled Shawnee, came on for hearing being the time and place fixed for hearing by the Commissioners at the September Session. And the Commissioners being fully satisfied from the Exhibits and the Evidence, that the petitioners, and their agent, were duly informed of the time and place of hearing said petition, for more than sixty days after the filing of the same, and that due and legal notice was given by the Agent of said Petitioners for more than six consecutive weeks in the Democratic Herald a newspaper of general circulation published in Perry County Ohio, of the time and place appointed for the hearing of said petition, and the Commissioners after hearing the evidence and after having heard and examined the said Petition, are satisfied that more than fifty qualified voters actually reside within the limits described in the petition, and that said petition has been signed by a majority of them (being 37 of them) that said limits have been accurately described and that an accurate map or plat thereof made and filed, that the name proposed for said incorporated Village is proper and sufficient to distinguish it from others of a like kind in the State and it is moreover deemed right and proper in the judgment and discretion of the Commissioners, that said petition should be adopted. It is therefore hereby ordered that said petition be granted and that the incorporated village of Shawnee so named and described in the petition, be organized.
