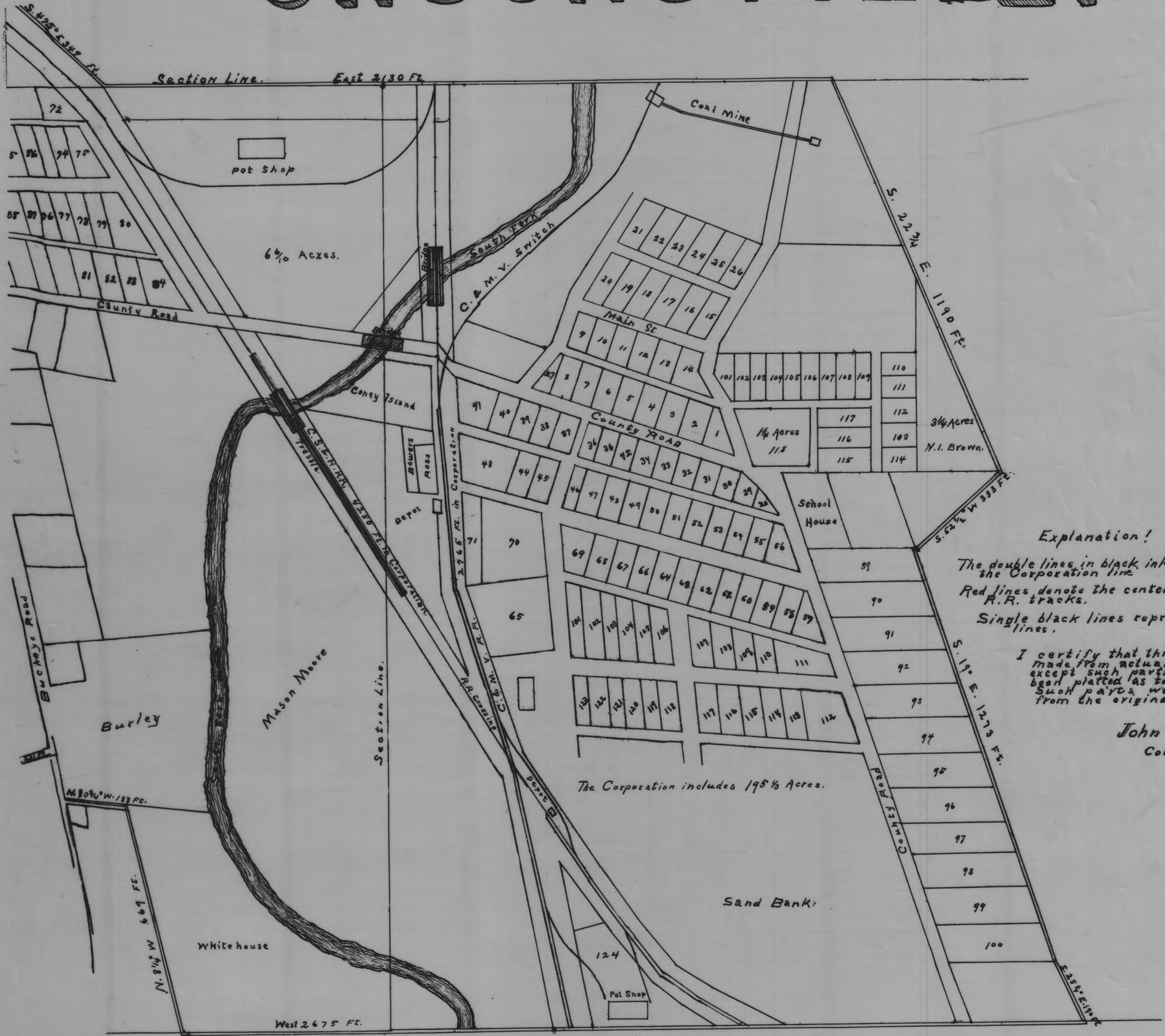


# CORPORATION OF CROOKSVILLE.

*Commissioners Journal Perry County This Regular Session Dec. 6, 1893*

*In the matter of the Incorporation of the Village of Crooksville*

*Upon the 6<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1893 the Board of County Commissioners being in regular session at Newington this day as agent for the petitioners presented to said Board of County Commissioners a petition signed by more than thirty electors residing within the proposed corporate limits, praying for the incorporation of certain territory described in said petition as a village to be named Crooksville. Said petition being accompanied by an accurate map of said territory together with and of full and correct copies of the fact stated in said petition upon which is based by said Board of County Commissioners the petitioners map and affidavits filed in the office of the County Auditor for the inspection of any person interested and the same were filed accordingly and thereupon said Board of County Commissioners on Monday the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1894 at 10 o'clock A.M. in the Court House in the Village of Newington this was the place for hearing said petition and the County Auditor is hereby commiserate thereunto said agent of said petitioners to the end that he may give notice thereof as required by law.*

*Commissioners Office Perry County Feb. 12, 1894*

*On this day the petition for the incorporation of certain territory in an village to be named the village of Crooksville, was read before the Board of County Commissioners of Perry County, Ohio, and said Board of Commissioners find that the petition contains all the matter that its statements are true and that the same is a proper one, that the limit of the proposed corporation is accurately described by said petition and is not unreasonably large or small, that the map that the petitioners have submitted to the petitioners is a true and correct map of the territory that is therein described and that notice has been given as required by law, that there is a requisite population for the proposed corporation and it is required just that the prayer of the petition be granted and the same is hereby granted.
