CERTIFIED COPY OF PROCEEDING TO AMEND PLA.
NARROW STREET IN N.T. BROWN'S FIRST ADDITION,
VILLAGE OF CROOKSVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, OHIO.,
ORDINANCE NO. 806

TO NARROW STREET BETWEEN EASE MAIN
STREET AND SAND STREET IN THE VILLAGE
OF CROOKSVILLE, OHIO.

WHEREAS, on the 17th day of October, 1949, a petition by all the persons owning lots on a certain street between East Main Street and Sand Street in the Village of Crooksville, Ohio, a distance of approximately 330 feet, was duly presented to Council, praying that said street between the points named be narrowed.

AND WHEREAS, Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such narrowing, as prayed for, and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CROOKSVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That said Street (unnamed), sometimes called Spring Street, extending on the east from East Main Street in a northerly direction to Sand Street, a distance of approximately 330 feet, be narrowed from the present 40 foot street to a width of 12 feet; that is, that there be 18 feet vacated on the east side thereof and 10 feet vacated on the west side thereof throughout its entire length, leaving a street 12 feet wide according to the plat annexed to this Ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED That a copy of this corrected plat be filed and recorded in the village records along with this Ordinance and that a copy thereof, together with a copy of this Ordinance, all duly certified, shall be filed with the County Recorder of Perry County, Ohio, with directions to said County Recorder to change the plat of said village accordingly.

Section 2: That this Ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

PETITION TO NARROW STREET

To the Council of the Village of Crooksville, Ohio:

The undersigned, owners of all the Lots in the Village of Crooksville, in the immediate vicinity of the street (now an alley) between Main Street and Sand Street in said village respectfully petition your honorable body that said street may be narrowed between the points above named and reduced from a 40 foot street or right of way to a 12 foot street; this to be done by vacating 18 feet on the east side thereof and 10 feet on the west side thereof, throughout its entire length.

Petitioners further say that it is of use to the public as a street; that it is more useful as a narrow street; that it has been in fact, used as a street for the last 25 years, since Main Street was paved; and that it will not be detrimental to the village to narrow it; but that it will be for the best interest of the village, the adjoining property owners and all concerned.
